TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

ACCEPTED

The number of applications that resulted in an offer of admission into the applied-for program for the reporting term, including provisional admissions and other qualified admission statuses.

ACCESS STUDENTS

Academically qualified undergraduate international students who need additional English language proficiency assistance. These students are admitted to the university provisionally and can earn up to 27 credits toward their degree while receiving additional English language support through resources offered by the university.

ADMINISTRATIVE/PROFESSIONAL FACULTY

Administrative/professional faculty perform work directly related to the management of the activities of the university. Incumbents in administrative faculty positions exercise discretion and independent judgement and generally direct the work of others. Professional faculty require advanced learning and experience acquired by prolonged formal instruction and/or specialized work experience. This category is normally limited to librarians, counselors, coaches, and other professional positions.

APPLIED/APPLICATIONS/APPLICANTS

The number of admission applications submitted for the reporting term. Individuals submitting multiple applications (e.g., applying for both an undergraduate and a graduate program, or more than one graduate program) are counted once for each application submitted; consequently, the count of graduate applied/applications/applicants may be greater than the number of individuals seeking admission to the university.

CENSUS DATA

A snapshot of student, course, and/or faculty and staff data collected at designated times for use in institutional, state, and federal reporting.

CERTIFICATE

A formal award certifying the satisfactory completion of a postsecondary program, but which does not qualify as a degree program.

CLASS LEVEL/STUDENT LEVEL

UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE-SEEKING:

- **Freshman:** A student who has earned fewer than 30 credit hours.
- **Sophomore:** A student who has earned 30-59 credit hours.
- **Junior:** A student who has earned 60-89 credit hours.
- **Senior:** A student who has earned at least 90 credit hours.

GRADUATE DEGREE-SEEKING:

- **Certificate:** A student whose primary program of study is one leading to a post-baccalaureate certificate.
- **Master's:** A student whose primary program of study is one leading to a master's degree.
- **Doctoral:** A student whose primary program of study is one leading to a doctoral degree.

PROFESSIONAL (LAW) DEGREE-SEEKING:

- Law students are classified as Law Day (full-time program) or Law Evening (part-time program) and by year in program, which is 1, 2, or 3 for Law Day students and 1, 2, 3, or 4 for Law Evening students.

NON-DEGREE-SEEKING:

- Non-degree seeking students are classified only as undergraduate or graduate based on the level of the coursework being pursued (NDU, NDG).

CLASSIFICATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS (CIP) CODE

A classification system established and updated by the United States Department of Education. Discipline and subdiscipline instructional programs are assigned a six digit code that is used in the U.S. and Canada for classification and reporting. This system is regularly updated.

CONTACT HOUR

A unit of measure that represents an hour of scheduled student instruction (usually 50 minutes of contact equals one hour). In most cases, a contact hour equals a credit hour. Examples of exceptions include studios or labs where multiple contact hours equal a credit hour.

CONTRACT COURSE

A course offered by contractual arrangement that may be paid for as a unit rather than via tuition charges to individual students.

COURSE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE)

A statistic derived from the student-credit hour productivity at the level of the course. The formula for calculating Course FTE is total credit hours in a course divided by 15 for the undergraduate and professional (LAW) levels, and total credit hours in a course divided by 12 for the graduate level.

CREDIT HOUR

A unit of measure of course work, independent study, or a related activity representing the equivalent of an hour of instruction per week usually over the entire term. It can be applied toward meeting the requirements of a degree, certificate, or other formal award.

DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENT

A student enrolled in courses for credit and with the intent of completing a degree or formal award and is recognized by the institution. High school students and non-degree students also enroll in post-secondary courses for credit but are not considered degree-seeking.

EMINENT SCHOLAR STIPENDS

Monies paid from GMU Foundation endowment funds and the State Eminent Scholars Matching Program to supplement the salaries of eminent full-time scholars such as the Robinson Professors.

ENROLLED/ENROLLEES

Students registered for at least one credit hour on the census date for the reporting term. New enrollees approved for admission to multiple programs are counted only once under the program designated as their primary program of study.

EXTENDED STUDIES OR NON-DEGREE

Classification of enrollment of non-degree seeking students.

FIRST-TIME FRESHMAN

- **Admissions:** An applicant who has never attended any postsecondary institution since graduation from high school, or whose only postsecondary enrollment was in the summer term immediately prior to their first fall enrollment, or who took college level courses while still enrolled in high school.
- **Student enrollment:** New student who qualifies as first-time freshman admissions, including those with sufficient Advanced Placement credit to be granted upper class standing.

FTE STUDENT

The FTE of students is a single value providing a meaningful combination of full-time and part-time students. It is a statistic derived from the student-credit hour productivity of the institution. In non-summer terms, the number of FTE students is obtained by dividing the total number of undergraduate, first professional

(law), and graduate credit hours per term by 15, 15, and 12, respectively. The number of FTE students in summer and annualized regular session (fall and spring semesters) is obtained by dividing the total number of undergraduate, first professional, and graduate credit hours per session by 30, 30, and 24, respectively. This definition should be distinguished from the definition of a full-time student.

FULL-TIME FACULTY

Full-Time, instructional, and research personnel holding the traditional ranks of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, and instructor. Designated as instructional or research faculty.

FULL-TIME STUDENT

An undergraduate student enrolled for 12 or more credit hours in a term; a graduate student enrolled for 9 or more credit hours, or holding a full-time assistantship and enrolled in at least 6 graduate credits, or enrolled in thesis or dissertation credits as defined in the University Catalog in a term; or a law student classified as a day student in a term.

GRADUATE ASSISTANT

Enrolled graduate students holding the positions of graduate teaching assistant, graduate research assistant, or graduate professional assistant. Traditionally, these positions range from 10 to 20 hours per week.

GRADUATE STUDENT

A student enrolled in a master's, doctoral, or graduate certificate program, not including law students. A non-degree-seeking student enrolled in graduate-level classes is also considered a graduate student.

HEADCOUNT STUDENT

The number of students enrolled for at least one credit hour in courses offered for degree or certificate credit, including students who are not admitted to a degree program. When student headcount is reported by academic division/department, the headcount is attributed to the department that administers the student's primary program of study.

IN-STATE STUDENT

A student whose official domicile is in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY

Faculty whose primary funding is from an Educational and General instructional account and whose primary purpose is instruction. Most salary comparisons such as AAUP are based only on full-time, instructional faculty.

LOWER DIVISION – BACCALAUREATE

- **Courses:** courses that are part of a baccalaureate program, generally taken by freshmen and sophomores, with course numbers in the range of 100-299.
- **Students:** students classified as freshmen or sophomores (those with fewer than 60 earned credit hours).

NEW STUDENT

- **Undergraduate student:** A student attending as a first-time, first-year student at any institution; includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended in the prior summer term. Transfer students entering the institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the undergraduate level, other than those dually enrolled while in high school.
- **Graduate student:** A student entering any institution for the first-time at that level.

NON-DEGREE SEEKING GRADUATE STUDENT

A student enrolled in graduate-level courses for credit who is not recognized as seeking a degree or certificate.

NON-DEGREE-SEEKING UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT

A student enrolled in undergraduate-level courses for credit who is not recognized as seeking a degree or certificate.

NON-RESIDENT ALIEN/FOREIGN NATIONAL

A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. (Source: IPEDS)

OUT-OF-STATE STUDENT

A student whose official domicile is not the Commonwealth of Virginia, and who therefore does not ordinarily qualify for in-state tuition rates.

PART-TIME FACULTY

Part-time or adjunct faculty hired for instruction with semester or year-long contracts.

PART-TIME STUDENT

An undergraduate student enrolled for fewer than 12 credit hours in a term; a graduate student enrolled for fewer than 9 credit hours; or holding a full-time assistantship and enrolled for fewer than 6 graduate credit hours, or enrolled in thesis or dissertation credit hours and not meeting other full-time enrollment criteria as defined in the University Catalog in a given term; or a law student classified as an evening student in a term.

POST-BACCALAUREATE CERTIFICATE

An award that requires completion of an organized program of study beyond the level of a bachelor's, but which does not meet the requirements of academic degrees carrying the title of master.

PROGRAM/ACADEMIC PROGRAM

A combination of courses and related activities organized for the attainment of broad educational objectives and approved by SCHEV and SACS.

RACE/ETHNICITY

Categories used to describe groups to which individuals belong or with which they identify. The categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. In official reporting, only U.S. citizens and permanent residents (resident aliens) are grouped by race/ethnicity. The groups used to categorize all students are:

- American Indian or Alaska Native
- Asian
- Black or African American
- Hispanic
- Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
- White
- Two or More Races
- Race/Ethnicity Not Reported
- Non-Resident Alien

RESEARCH FACULTY

Faculty whose primary funding is from a research account and whose primary purpose is research.

TERM FACULTY

Full-time faculty hired on fixed term contracts who hold academic rank but are not eligible for tenure.

RETURNING/CONTINUING STUDENT

A student who previously has been enrolled at Mason at the same degree level.

TENURED FACULTY

Full-time faculty who have a contract without term. Tenure is awarded to full-time faculty who have demonstrated excellence in teaching, research, and service.

TENURE-TRACK FACULTY

Faculty on track to receive tenure once they meet required criteria; eligible for, but not yet awarded tenure.

TERMINAL DEGREE

The highest earned degree in a discipline. In most cases, this is the doctorate (PhD, DA, DNP). In the fine arts, the Master's of Fine Arts (MFA) degree is considered the highest degree. The JD in law is considered a terminal degree.

TRANSFER STUDENT

A student entering the institution for the first time and known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level. A student who was dual-enrolled at a college or university while still enrolled in high school is counted as a first-time freshman, not as a transfer student.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT

A student enrolled in a four-year bachelor's degree program, certificate students taking primarily undergraduate courses, or non-degree seeking students enrolled in undergraduate level classes are considered undergraduate students.

UPPER DIVISION – BACCALAUREATE

- **Courses:** courses that are part of a baccalaureate program, generally taken by juniors and seniors, with course numbers in the range of 300-599.
- **Students:** students classified as juniors or seniors (those with at least 60 earned credit hours).
